Year 7	Learners will explore different note values (minims, crotchets, quavers, semiquavers). Learners will be able to identify music techniques such as unison, call and repeat, call and response, layering rhythms. Learners will begin to include musical element vocabulary e.g. dynamics, tempo, duration, structure.	Developing an awareness of music from a different area of the world.
